High-tech, energy efficient cluster

Rotferdam has a leading position in the trade, transport, conversion and storage of energy-related commodities. A highly specialised cluster of 120 companies is active in the energy and chemical cluster. Within the group of global energy hubs the Rotterdam cluster is leading in the shift to sustainable energy: LNG terminals facilitate the use of cleaner burning LNG in road, sea- and inland transport. Re-use of industrial heat for residential use and CO2 for agricultural purposes make Rotterdam and energy-efficient port.

Investment in technologies

Rotterdam has commenced a strategic transition away from fossil energy system. Transition fuels such as LNG accelerate the move towards cleaner and greener fuels. Advanced plans for large scale Carbon Capture and Storage of

industry emissions are underway. In the field of offshore wind, the port has become a fast-growing manufacturing and logistic hub, whilst becoming a substantial producer of wind energy in its own right.

Blue hydrogen

One example of coordinated efforts to lower emissions is the production of 'blue' hydrogen. Although fossil fuels are used in this process, the CO2 that is released during production is stored in empty gas fields under the North Sea. The use of Blue Hydrogen is a stepping stone to the production of Green Hydrogen, which will be generated with energy from sustainable sources. New grid infrastructure for the exchange of hydrogen, steam, CO2 and other resources enables the cluster to become greener together.
